### DEAR CHURCH,

Over the past few weeks in worship we have been exploring the Gospel of Mark. It seems like the deeper we go the more zingers Jesus throws out to us. Why does Jesus do that? One week he said something about the first becoming last and the last becoming first. The next week he said something about siding with the powerless and irrelevant children versus those in positions of power. On another Sunday we heard Jesus teach a rich young man something about the eye of a needle and a camel with respect to the powerful and eternal life. Then he said something about doing concrete acts of goodness for the poor. This week as I prepare for worship Jesus has more hard words for the disciples and us to swallow.

James and John, two of the disciples, tell Jesus they want him to listen to them. They want him to make them great and powerful. Jesus pushes back and basically says, "Be careful what you wish for." He asks them whether they can really walk the walk, and he says that if his followers want to become great they must become servants (not-so-great, right?). There's a difference between rulers and leaders, Jesus tells James and John. Great leaders *lead* and but great rulers *lord over* people. "For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve..." – says Jesus. God's Son became servant to all...that many might live. This is important stuff. We better pray about it. Better yet, we better pray and do something with it.

November is here and not only does this month mean that fall is here, but it means change is on the horizon. You can hardly flip through the channels on your TV without seeing a campaign ad these days. To pretend this isn't a thing would be irresponsible and to pretend churches don't have people who care about our city, state, nation, and world. Therefore, I'll keep this short and sweet. Pray and ponder.

Over the past few weeks we have contemplated and prayed and worshipped through the lens of Jesus' words. Jesus has taught us about what the Kingdom of God looks like. Jesus has told us about what power really is. Jesus has shared with us his thoughts on leadership and lordship. Jesus has shown us his path and what that looks like in his words and deeds. Therefore, it is my prayer for each of us as citizens *and* as the Body of Christ, that we might make informed, careful, and prayerful decisions about our local, state, and national elected officials this fall. Jesus has told us an awful lot about leaders.

It is now up to us to decide what kind of leaders we want to lead us. Pray and consider.

No matter what the outcomes or who you vote for— whether it's a school board member, a comptroller, a senator, a governor, a sheriff, or a county dog catcher— I will be praying for you, our city, state, and country. Pray. Go. Do.


